Book Release: In *The Female Persuasion* by Meg Wolitzer, "Greer Kadetsky is a shy college freshman when she meets the woman she hopes will change her life—Faith Frank, a central pillar of the women's movement for decades."

4

Lead your patrons on a walking tour of your library or community for **National Walking Day**. Create an audiobook display and highlight your eAudio collection to encourage them to listen to books on the go.

5

Check with your Department of Transportation or tourism board for free copies of your state's road map for **Read a Road Map Day**. Help patrons plan their next road trip with resources in your travel collection, or remember favorite trips by **embroidering old maps**.

6

Create a display of all things Scotland and **Outlander** on **National Tartan Day**. Celebrate Scottish heritage with a bagpipe demonstration.

7

Celebrate **New Beer's Day**, which commemorates the 21st Amendment, with a demonstration about home brewing or that highlights local micro-breweries in your community.

8

Highlight resources in your collection on the Chinese philosophy of creating harmonious surroundings for **International Feng Shui Awareness Day**, or invite a local expert to your library to **share tips on organization and peaceful design**.

9

Introduce an activity that will appeal to both your crafters and gardeners. Add a little beauty to home gardens with **beaded wind chimes**.

10

Book Release: In *Paper Girls, Vol. 4* by Brian K. Vaughan, "An intrepid newspaper deliverer, Tiffany, is launched from the prehistoric past into the year 2000."

11

Sponsor a donation drive for a local shelter, or plan a program with a veterinarian to speak about selecting the perfect pet for your family on **National Pet Day**.

12

Create a display of books and movies that celebrate space travel for **International Day of Human Space Flight**. Pair your display with a view of *The Right Stuff*, the 1983 movie that focuses on our first astronauts.

13

Invite patrons to send in funny **"pet shaming"** pictures on **Blame Someone Else Day** (always the first Friday the 13th of the year). Make sure they tag pics with your library's name on social media so you can see them.

14

Work with a local museum or art gallery to host an event for **Slow Art Day**, "a global event with a simple mission: help more people discover for themselves the joy of looking at and loving art."

15

Explore the **American Kitefliers Association** website for regional resources and events for **Go Fly a Kite Day**. Plan a fun family event with stunt kite demonstrations and **DIY kite building**.

16

Host a beginner's **Tai Chi** or yoga class to encourage your community to practice self-care on **National Stress Awareness Day**. Share "**9 Strategies for Battling Stress**" from *Popular Science* magazine.

17

Set up a passive programming station and invite patrons to create original poetry to display and share on **International Haiku Poetry Day**.

18

World Amateur Radio Day
Host a meet-up at your library for **Ham Radio** enthusiasts and those interested in learning more about the popular hobby. Guide the group to resources they can use to get started in the fun, social activity.

19

Send your librarians out into the community for **National High Five Day**. Visit local organizations to promote library programs and services and have fun getting to know patrons.

20

Thank your library volunteers with a little **sunshine and appreciation** on **Volunteer Recognition Day**.

21

Money Smart Week (April 21 – 28) is a national initiative between the American Library Association and the Federal Reserve Bank to provide financial literacy programming to communities. Check out ALA's list of resources for participating.

22

Get crafty with projects inspired by nature for **Earth Day**. Make **river rock welcome mats** or **portable flower presses** that can inspire nature walks.

Remind your patrons to look up toward the night sky for the **Lyrid Meteor Shower**.

23

Work with your Parks and Recreation Department to promote and host family events for **National Picnic Day**. Plan a storytime or **field day** in your community and encourage participants to bring blankets and picnic lunches to enjoy the outdoors.

24

Encourage patrons to get creative: Hold an adult coloring program or **paint night event**.



25

Host an event to celebrate **National DNA Day**. Register your event online and get activity ideas from the **National Human Genome Research Institute**.

26

Set up an easy **slow-cooker chocolate bar** with sprinkles drizzle on tasty treats for **National Pretzel Day**.

Encourage staff to participate in **Take Our Daughters and Sons to Work Day**. Invite children to help plan and host a family program for the day.

27

Celebrate the Great Bambino on **Babe Ruth Day** with a screening of the 1992 movie *The Babe* starring John Goodman. On this day in 1947, Babe Ruth appeared at Yankee Stadium to thank his former club.

28

Encourage your community to bring their favorite board games to the library for **International Tabletop Day**. Consider starting a **circulating collection** for families to enjoy gaming together at home.

29

Work with local cultural groups to plan an event for **International Dance Day**, which celebrates forms of dance across the world. Host demonstrations of different ethnic dances or invite teachers to present beginners classes.

30

Invite a local hairstylist to your library for a **Daddy Daughter Hair Factory** class at your library on **Hairstylist Appreciation Day**. Help dads build confidence in helping their daughter's feel and look great.
